

I Went Walking Lesson Plan | Scholastic.com

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I use *I Went Walking* for teaching about patterns and using repetitive text in writing. My students like to read along with the repetitive text. They also like creating their own story using repetitive text.

Students will develop a familiarity and understanding of the structure and patterns found in predictable texts.

Directions

Encourage the students to read along with the repetitive text of the story. Have the students predict what will come next in the story.

Help the children create new repetitive text to write their own story. For example,
I went traveling. How did you go? I went in a school bus to my school.
I went traveling. How did you go? I flew in an airplane to Germany.
I went traveling. How did you go? I rode in a firetruck to put out a fire.

Import free global photos from <http://edcommunity.apple.com/ali/story.php?itemID=794&version=7&collectionID=171>, digital photos the students take, or scanned photos the students bring from home. Using iPhoto or a word processor, create a book using the students' new text and the photos.
