


Questions for Around the Dinner Table




Activities with Your Family and Friends

- 7. Plan a breakfast party for your family and help cook.


Did You Know?





- 6. Ask an adult to help you find directions on how to make a friendship bracelet. Complete the bracelet design. Then, think of an unlikely friend to give it to.





Never Grow Up Crossword Puzzle



Did You Know?

- Peter Pan is based off the book Peter & Wendy, which was written in 1911

- According to NASA, about 30 meteor showers occur each year that are visible to observers on Earth.
