









## CONNECT AND COLOR

# PRINCESS SUSAN'S LEMONADE

Everyone knows that you can't face the fiery breath of a dragon without a nice cold lemonade! With an adult's help, make lemonade to share with friends or create a lemonade stand business like Princess Susan did!

## PRINCESS SUSAN'S LEMONADE

### **INGREDIENTS**

34 to 1 cup sugar

1 cup water

1 cup lemon juice from 4 to 6 lemons

2 to 3 cups cold water

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

Place the sugar and water in a small saucepan and bring to a simmer over medium heat. Stir until the sugar dissolves. This is called simple syrup.

Juice the lemons until you get 1 cup of lemon juice. Be sure to remove all seeds.

Pour the lemon juice and the simple syrup into a serving pitcher. Add 2 to 3 cups of cold water and stir. Add ice and taste. If it's a little too sweet, add more lemon juice. If it's a little too sour, stir till the ice melts a bit and taste again. If it's still too sour, add more water.
