





IDEAS FOR USING CHARACTER CUTOUTS

- Attach a craft stick to each figure and use them as puppets when reading or retelling the story.
 - Use the cutouts to create a diorama of one scene from the story.
 - Write character profiles for each cutout.
 - Use the figures to decorate a bulletin board about fairy tales.
- Hand one character to each child. As you read the story aloud, invite children to stand or hold up their figure as their character appears in the story.



EXTENSION ACTIVITIES



- The troll thinks of all sorts of delicious ways to prepare goat for supper: a goat pot roast, goat rump in a honey glaze, goat jerky, and more! While anticipating the third goat's arrival, he asks, "What rhymes with strudel?" Brainstorm a list of words that rhyme with strudel and write some new mouthwatering goatinspired dialog for the troll.
- Read a more traditional telling of "The Three Billy Goats Gruff" and list the elements common to both stories. How does this version depart from tradition?
- What do you think happens to the troll once he floats down the river? Write a story about the troll's life after his encounter with the three Billy Goats Gruff.
- We know the goat brothers have the last name Gruff, but what are their first names? Think about the character traits of each goat in the story and come up with a first name for each one.
- The troll certainly loves to eat! Design a menu for a Troll Café. Include elements common to most restaurant menus—appetizers, main courses, desserts, and drinks.
- The third goat brother is much, much bigger than his siblings. How do you think he got to be so large? Was he hit by a growth ray gun? Did he escape from a giant's farm? Does he take after anyone in the Gruff goat family? Create a three- to six-panel comic strip about the third Billy Goat Gruff.

TROLL: I love goat! Let me count the ways.


Goat rump in a honey glaze.

GOAT #2: No! You don't want to eat me. I would only spoil your appetite. If you let me cross, I'll tell you a secret: Soon my big brother will come this way and he is much fatter and tastier than I am.

TROLL: OK. You may pass.

NARRATOR: CLIP, CLOP! CLIP, CLOP! went the bridge.

TROLL: Who seeks to reach the grassy ridge? Who dares to walk across my bridge? Oh... Um... Wow. You're really big. [tiny voice] I'll eat you up... you little goat."

GOAT #3: No. You will not.

NARRATOR: And the third Billy Goat Gruff rammed into the troll, who flew off the bridge, into the rapids and over the waterfall. Where he ended up, I really can't say. I've never gone that far. There are too many mosquitos.


